About our Speakers

Bill Baumann, MS, CRC, CCM - Bill is the Vice President of the Supported Living Programs and Vocational Services at the Center for Comprehensive Services (CCS) in Carbondale, Illinois, a MENTOR ABI Group partner. He has been at CCS since 1986 having worked as the Coordinator of Client Advocacy, Associate Director of Case Management and Vocational Services, and Program Director for Supported Living. He received his Masters degree in Rehabilitation Counseling from Southern Illinois University in 1978. Since this time he has designed and implemented services for people with acquired brain injury as a Vocational Counselor at the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago and as the Assistant Director at Phase Four, Transitional Living Program, and in his present position. He has given numerous ABI presentations to people living with the effects of an ABI, family members and professions on Quality of Life issues, Vocational Rehabilitation and Extended Support Services. He has been active with national, state and local organizations in support of persons with an ABI and their family members.

Roger N. Braden, JD, RN - Roger is a partner with Sutton, Hicks, Lucas, Grayson & Braden, PLC in Edgewood, Kentucky since 2001 and has been practicing law since 1984. An experienced attorney and a former Registered Nurse with vast experience in trauma cases, Roger concentrates his law practice in the areas of catastrophic brain injury, personal injury and health law.
